



School Commitment Form 2020-2021 Onsite Learning

As a follow up to the survey, **all families** must complete the commitment form for each of their children. The deadline is **noon on Wednesday, September 30**. Please read the following information to guide you in the decision making process and sign indicating your commitment to either face-to-face or remote learning. The second nine-week period begins October 13, 2020.

| FACE-TO-FACE CHOICE | REMOTE LEARNING CHOICE |
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| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● All parents/guardians must self-screen their child(ren) for COVID-19 related symptoms prior to leaving their residence. Students will also be screened at school. Students with a temperature at or above 100.4 may not attend school that day or until the temperature is normal without medication. ● Isolation spaces are provided for students who exhibit symptoms while on the bus and at school until parents are contacted. ● Students exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19 or in a household with a confirmed positive case, are prohibited from coming to school and will have to work remotely until it is determined by his/her physician that it is permissible to return onsite. ● MPS will provide all students with 3 reusable masks (face coverings) ● Students will receive training on the procedures of preventative health measures to maintain a safe and healthy environment at the beginning of the nine-week period. ● Visitors and parents are restricted from entering school buildings to observe classrooms or walk students to class. ● Uniforms will be required onsite. ● All students will follow a modified schedule to reduce the number of classroom changes in a day. ● Classroom surfaces and materials will be cleaned and sanitized throughout the day. ● Middle and high school students will not utilize locker rooms to change clothing for physical education. Students will not dress out. | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Attendance and regular participation is mandatory. Remote students are required to log in daily to complete instructional requirements. Grades will be negatively impacted by students not logging in and not completing assignments. ● Students who are not logging in regularly and/or not submitting assignments will be required to attend onsite. ● Teachers assigned to students will guide them through the coursework. ● Students attending remotely will follow a daily schedule just as the onsite students. ● Devices will be available to students in need. ● Students who elect the virtual option must have access to the Internet. ● Students must have daily contact with their classroom teacher(s). ● Lessons will be recorded daily. Recorded lessons will be placed in Schoology by 4pm daily. ● Each core course teacher must have a dedicated intervention time to support struggling students. |

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| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Students who refuse to abide by wearing their masks or practice social distancing and continue to put other students in unhealthy situations will be required to attend remotely. ● Custodial staff will focus on cleaning high touch surfaces often during school hours. ● Water fountains will not be used. Students may bring their own water bottles. ● Hand sanitizer stations are installed in various locations in each building. ● Students are required to wear a mask on the bus at all times as indicated by required state guidelines. Students are expected to sit in assigned seats. ● All buses will be disinfected before and after each route or use. ● Students who exhibit COVID-19 signs while on the bus, will be placed in an isolation area on the bus. ● Food and drink will not be allowed to be consumed on the bus. ● Students are expected to report directly to their classroom to avoid congregating in hallways. ● Teachers assigned to students will guide them through the coursework. ● Schools will serve grab and go breakfasts and lunches. Warm and cold options will be available. | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Students must be appropriately dressed when on screen. ● Students must be visible on screen while participating in classes. ● If students attend school remotely during the normal school day, they can only attend extended-day classes remotely. ● Students who elect to learn virtually are eligible to participate in sports. ● Families may continue to pick up Grab and Go lunches from the schools weekly. |
